

You might know it as the "big clock at Knott's Berry Farm". You probably have seen it many times. But I know it as my Great-Grandfather's legacy.

The Dreger Clock (named for its creator Andrew Dreger Sr.) first came to Knott's Berry Farm in 1953 after Andrew Dreger's death. It was enjoyed for over 50 years by the public, just as my Great Grandfather intended.

But recently it was removed from public display at Knott's and stashed away in a warehouse.

The clock has since been purchased by the Buena Park Historical Society with the intent of restoring this interesting historical emblem of Buena Park and once again placing it where it can be enjoyed by the public.
